The function of the kit is to give you the tools you need to successfully design and execute a complete retreat experience.

Each retreat is a learning experience — one in which participating medical professionals and facilitators learn from those who are dealing with the disease. Continuing to identify the needs of the retreats' attendees provides an opportunity to help patients on a much larger scale.
